GFASG Food Justice Scholar-Activist/Activist-Scholar Community of Practice: Highlights from 2018, and Looking Forward, by Kristin Reynolds

The Food Justice Scholar-Activism/Activist Scholarship (FJSAAS) community of practice is a working group within the Geographies of Food and Agriculture Specialty Group. As a community of practice, we are focused on:

- the meaning and scalability of "food justice" (in urban and rural spaces), as both a paradigm and material goal;
- productive questioning of the dichotomy between activist and scholar;
- recognition of experience-based food systems expertise in a variety of settings (e.g., community; academia;
- policy making);
- and the potential roles of academics/academic work in advancing food justice.

These topics are of direct and historical relevance to the field of geography, both theoretically and practically.

As a community of practice, our intent is to support collaboration among a broad diversity of actors in the food system, through the lens of geography and other fields, and help to strengthen the integrity of both food justice scholarship and activism. A couple of recent and current projects exemplify our work:

- In 2018, several members, along with other scholars and activists, published a special issue on food justice scholar-activism in the open-access journal <u>ACME: An International</u> <u>Journal for Critical Geographies</u>. (Vol. 17, No. 4, 2018, Guest editors Reynolds, Block, and Bradley.)
- FJSAAS is collaborating to co-host the Radical Food Geographies workshop on April 2, 2019. (See details in this newsletter and online here: <u>https://gfasg.wordpress.com/events/</u>)


